WELFARE TRUST SCHEME: -

Delhi pharmacy Council has introduced a scheme for the benefits of the Registered Pharmacists in Delhi in order to extend the services of Giving financial security to the survivors of the registered pharmacists in the event of death of the pharmacist upto the tune of Rs. 50,000/- and will further be extended to the ailing registered pharmacist for their medical needs and many more welfare schemes depending on the response as mentioned in the objectives of the trust detailed below: -

OBJECTS OF THE TRUST: -

The main objects of this trust are: -

- (a) To give financial security to the survivors of the family of the registered pharmacist in the event of his/her death up to Rs. 50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand only).
- (b) To Create Drug Information Centre for consumers.
- (c) To Provide financial assistance for education of needy children of economically weak pharmacists on merit basis.
- (d) To award best pharmacy & Best Pharmacist award every year.
- (e) To extend financial assistance to meet the hospitalization and treatment expenses of diseases like cancer, AIDS, Hepatitis B, Open Heart Surgery, Kidney Transplantation, or any other serious condition confirmed by the specialist as per the discretion of the trust.

Continuing Education Programme for the Registered Pharmacists: -

Delhi Pharmacy Council has started the continuing education programme for the welfare of the pharmacists and has successfully conducted 5 such programmes in order to upgrade their knowledge and Pharmacy Council of india is going to be mandatory for the renewal of the registration.

Appointment of Pharmacy Inspectors: -

The council is going to appoint pharmacy inspectors as provided u/s 26 (1) of the pharmacy Act 1948, the proposal has been sent to Govt. of Delhi for approval
